Kimberley 16 – 19 Sixth Form College A level Results

It has been another successful year at Kimberley Sixth Form College this year. The College, part of Wootton Academy Trust and based in Stewartby, has for the third-year running been identified in the top twenty performing sixth form colleges by 'The Sunday Times'. Following another set of excellent results, this position should improve further.

To cap a fantastic year the students of the college have produced a set of excellent results in both A Level and BTEC subjects. Kimberley College Principal, Tim Detheridge, was delighted to see an 8% increase in the number of students achieving 3 or more A levels or equivalent and that 5% of the cohort achieved a full sweep of A*/A grades. Harry Huang achieved A*, A* in chemistry and maths and A in physics whilst balancing his studies with taking time off to represent England at Badminton in international tournaments around the world. Harry will be off to Imperial College, London where he intends to study chemistry and molecular physics.

There have been many success stories this year for students. Worthy of note is the performance of Daniel Viney who has achieved D*, D* in his Graphics BTEC and an A grade in art. Dan has earned a place at the University of Hertfordshire on the prestigious and highly competitive animation course.
